



Beaded Mohair Shawl F206

Materials 1-2 skeins of Artyarns Beaded Mohair
Knitting needles: Size 10 U.S.
Stitch marker

Gauge 3 sts and 6 rows = 1" in stockinette

Measurements Scarf version with 1 skein: 28" on each of 2 sides of triangle x 42" wide across top

Key K2tog Knit two stitches together as though they were one stitch, a decrease of one (right-slanting)
Yo Yarn over needle an extra time as though to increase an extra stitch
Ssk Slip 1 stitch knitwise, slip 1 stitch purlwise, insert left needle through front of both loops, and knit together with right needle, a decrease of one (left-slanting)
Inc1 Knit into the front and back of a stitch, pulling two stitches from one stitch, an increase of one
Pinc1 Purl into the front and back of a stitch, pulling two stitches from one stitch, an increase of one
PM Place marker

Beaded Mohair Shawl

Instructions

Pattern Stitches:

Openwork Stitch Right (OSR): *k2tog, yo; repeat from *

Openwork Stitch Left (OSL): *yo, ssk; repeat from *

Note: This triangular scarf/shawl is knitted from the top straight edge down, and bound off when the yarn has nearly run out. Therefore, it can be done with 1 or 2 or more skeins of the yarn.

Cast on 3 sts.

Row 1: K1, inc1, k1

Row 2: Inc1, Inc1, PM, p2—6 sts

Row 3: Inc1, k to marker, RM, inc1, PM, k to end—8 sts

Row 4: Inc1, p to marker, RM, pinc1, PM, p to end—10 sts

Row 5: Inc1, k1, OSR to marker, RM, inc1, PM, OSL to last 3 sts, k3

Row 6: Inc1, p to marker, RM, pinc1, PM, p to end.

Row 7: Inc1, OSR to st before marker, k1, RM, inc1, PM, k1, OSL to last 2 sts, k2

Row 8: Inc1, p to marker, RM, pinc1, PM, p to end.

Repeat Rows 5-8 a total of four times (16 rows)

Then repeat rows 3-4 a total of three times (6 rows)

Continue in this manner until all the yarn has been used up, leaving enough to bind off. Bind off with larger needle very loosely.
